Fukuda, Mitsuo is passionate about developing and releasing the leaders. He has been consulting, training and coaching companies, nonprofit organizations, universities and local as well as central government officers. Since the 2011 triple disaster, he has been consulting and coaching entrepreneurs to develop businesses as rebuilding the communities devastated by the Tsunami. After finishing Graduate School at Kwansei Gakuin University, he researched Contextualization and Cultural Anthropology at Fuller Graduate School as a Fulbright Graduate Student and received a doctorate degree in Intercultural Studies. He is the author of several books. *Plenary Speaker.*

Johnson, Andrea and her husband Tim have been missionaries in Japan for 25 years with the Evangelical Covenant Church. They have served in rural and urban contexts in community outreach, discipleship, pastoral ministry, and education. Andrea is currently working on a Doctor of Ministry in Leadership and Spiritual Formation from George Fox Seminary. *Windows into Another World How do the values and culture of our heart language affect how we hear and respond to the gospel? This workshop will explore differences in values and culture between Japan and the US and consider how this may affect communication of the gospel and discipling of Japanese believers.*

Ramquist, Sylvia and her husband Mark served as missionaries in Japan for 20 years, using music and English classes as ministry tools.. She now serves as International Minister at Westminster Chapel. *Evangelism 101: What's the Big Deal About Asking Questions?
